

Action Statements - not prioritized

The following items did not receive a priority vote, but may further inform the work plan in areas that were prioritized:

- 1. Extend SB4 allowing PERS exceptions for retired nurse faculty [until the faculty shortage is abated]
- 2. Describe quality standards for RN-BSN programs
- 3. Define, publish and actively support existing initiatives to develop front-line staff to lead improvement processes
- 4. Determine major health initiatives taking place in Oregon and nursing leadership engagement that is being provided or that is needed
- 5. Host a health policy course/workshop for nurses
- 6. Create, strengthen and support nurses in working more interprofessionally
- 7. Support presentations by nurses who are implementing aspects of IOM recommendations and other good work
- 8. Define standards for transition to practice at all levels
- 9. Have nursing students present at every OAC meeting for credit
- 10. Invite aspiring nurse leaders to experience participation in OAC and other leadership groups
- 11. Visibly engage at least two key non-nursing organizations in the OAC
- 12. Every OAC steering committee mentors a nurse that they include in meetings throughout the year
- 13. Assure that OAC information is easily accessible via links with other nurse org websites
- 14. Encourage educational institutions to include students on all committees
